

2021 Donation Publication Submission Satisfaction Survey Evaluation Report

1. Introduction

As part of the "AGU Library Book Box Project," conducted by the Abdullah Gül University Library and Documentation Department, an evaluation survey was conducted to measure the satisfaction levels of the institutions receiving publications in 2021. This report was prepared based on feedback received from three different institutions.

2. Participating Institutions

- Bolvadin Penitentiary
- Erciyes University Faculty of Theology

3. Summary of Survey Results

Question	Joint Assessment
Do the submitted posts match the selection list?	All institutions stated that the submitted publications matched the previously submitted election list.
Satisfaction level with the institutional library	Participating institutions rated their overall satisfaction level as high. Average: 4.7/5
Beneficiary satisfaction level	Beneficiaries' satisfaction level is high. Average: 4.7/5

4. Highlights from Participant Opinions

- It is recommended that more publications be obtained from publishing houses.
- It has been suggested that more space should be given to novels and personal development books.
- It is recommended to send information emails regarding extra copies of publications.
- It is recommended that extra copies be shared via web/mailing.

5. General Evaluation and Recommendations

The survey results indicate that the donation publication submission process is valued and well-received by institutions. Based on participant feedback, the following recommendations can be developed:

- Providing a wider variety of publications from different publishing houses
- Special content planning for prisons and similar institutions (novel, personal development, etc.)
- Periodic announcement of excess copies of books in libraries

6. Conclusion

A survey conducted as part of the 2021 donation publication sending activity revealed that the activity was effective and received positive feedback at the institutional level. Considering these suggestions for improvement will contribute to the implementation of more efficient and targeted donation practices in the future.
